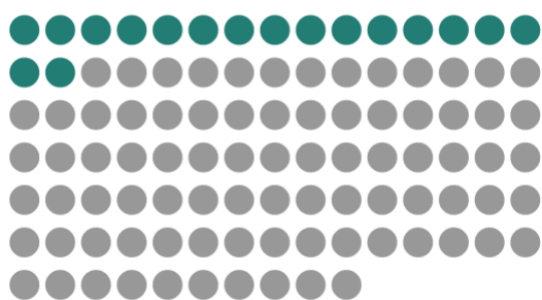




FCAA Data Spotlight: Women & Girls

In 2014, approximately 98 private funders disbursed \$105,279,054 million in support of global HIV/AIDS programs that specifically benefited women and girls.

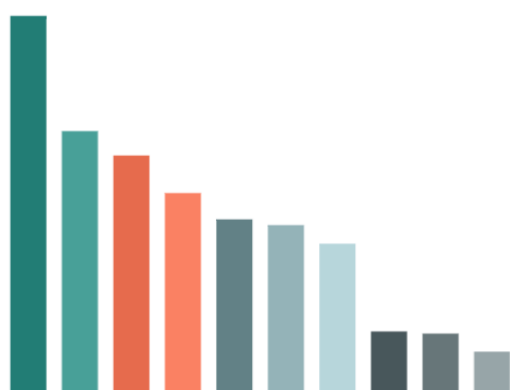

 of total HIV/AIDS-related philanthropy in 2014 specifically benefited women & girls



43%
 of total HIV/AIDS-related philanthropy for women and girls was directed to East & Southern Africa, followed by 19% for global programs (non-country specific), and 10% to the U.S.

 of total HIV/AIDS-related funding for women and girls supported efforts focused on the elimination of mother-to-child transmission of HIV, followed by 26% to advocacy, 23% to prevention, and 20% to treatment.
