This resource provides an overview of the HIV epidemic in Marion County, Indiana and the amount of HIV-related philanthropic funding received by organizations there in 2020. It complements a data partnership between Funders Concerned About AIDS (FCAA) and AIDS Vu, offering a glimpse at what the HIV epidemic looks like in the 57 jurisdictions prioritized in the Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S. Initiative (EHE).

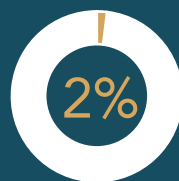
### HIV Philanthropic Funding

In 2020, almost \$60 million -or 19% of HIV-related philanthropy to the US - reached the 57 Ending the HIV Epidemic jurisdictions. Less than two percent of that funding reached organizations based in Marion County.

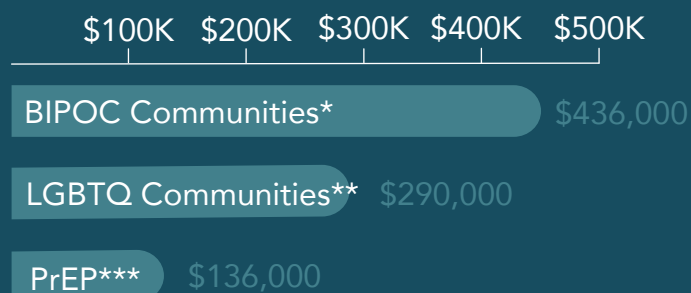

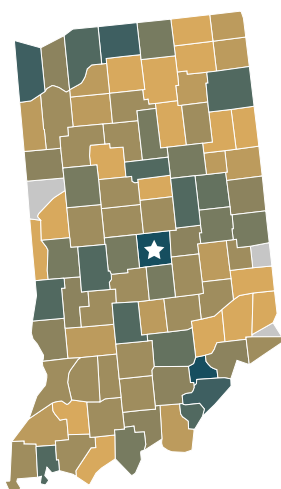

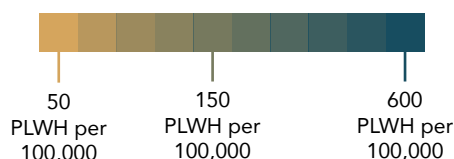
